Please keep an eye out for motorized vehicles on the beach. Driving motor vehicles on the beach is illegal in Alabama. According to Alabama Statute Title 32-Motor Vehicles and Traffic, motor vehicles are not permitted on beaches or dunes except for construction of houses or repair of utilities. In addition, on Fort Morgan Peninsula, the Share the Beach turtle conservation program is allowed to drive ATV/UTVs on the beach to protect and monitor nesting turtles from May 1-October 31 each year. Please report violations immediately to the Sheriff. On Bon Secour National Wildlife Refuge, Refuge staff and law enforcement officers are allowed to drive on the beach throughout the year.

As Spring Break winds down, hopefully, we'll get a little break before the summer season begins. The combination of high winds and salt build-up on power pole connections has been dangerous, causing numerous grass fires in our area. The salt causes arcing, which sets the power poles on fire, and the high winds have caused power lines to fall and start grass fires. At times, we had multiple fires going on at the same time. Also, the number of auto accidents increased in March, and we can probably attribute that to Spring Break.

The ADEM burn ban begins on May 1, so if you do burn before then, please use caution on windy days, always have a water-charged garden hose on hand, and never leave a fire unattended.

## Fort Morgan State Historic Site......Mike Bailey, Site Director

Spring break was a busy time at Fort Morgan this year. Besides large numbers of visitors, there have been numerous school groups visit the Fort during the month of April. On April 14th a new historic marker was dedicated by the Galvez Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution. This marker details the exploits of Bernardo de Galvez in lower Mobile Bay and Mobile Point. Galvez was responsible for the construction of the first documented fort on Mobile Point that was constructed in February 1780 and was armed with eight cannons and manned by 100 men. This cooperative effort between the Sons of the American Revolution and the Fort is a fine example of private groups and the Fort working together to preserve and enhance the site's long military history.

The turtle nesting season begins May 1<sup>st</sup>!!! The "Dawn Patrols" to identify and mark nests begin that day. The Fort Morgan team thanks Bon Secour Refuge for the loan of their UTV to patrol the beach. Fort Morgan team members will do all the driving for the first time this year. Patrols will begin at Vacation Lane. Thanks to Tucker Crumb for the use of her facilities.

Mama Turtles are coming soon, so be sure your exterior lights are off after dark and blinds and curtains are closed. Lights seen from the beach can prevent turtles from laying and, later, lure hatchlings away from the water and into danger from traffic, predators, dehydration and death.

Please remove your tents, shelters, and chairs from the beach each evening so mama turtles have access to the safer, upper beach to lay nests. Also, avoid digging gargantuan holes in the sand or cover them up before evening when you leave. Turtles have been known to become stuck in deep holes, unable to climb out. Deep holes are also a danger to morning patrol volunteers.

# Mobile Baykeeper Launched #ReduceTheUse Campaign on Earth Day

Mobile Baykeeper launched its #ReduceThe Use campaign April 22nd (Earth Day). The goal of this social media campaign is to reduce the use of **single-use** plastic straws, plastic bottles, and plastic bags to prevent these products from littering local waterways.

Mobile Baykeeper Education & Outreach Coordinator Jamie Bullock is leading the campaign. "Educating our citizens on the negative environmental impacts of these products is vitally important, particularly in a community that thrives on its natural resources," says Bullock. "We aren't asking people to completely get rid of these products--we know there are instances when we all need them. We just want to encourage citizens to think twice about it, and consider using alternatives when possible."

Bullock and the rest of the Mobile Baykeeper team will be challenging individuals, restaurants, bars, and businesses to reduce the use of these products and consider more environmentally friendly materials as an alternative. # Construction Update for "Governor's Mansion" on Fort Morgan

The State-owned beach house was damaged some 20 years ago by a hurricane and has sat unused and deteriorating ever since. Gov. Bentley is having it completely renovated with funds from the 2010 BP oil spill settlement. The perimeter wall is now extended 50' southward toward the beach. It appears the new roof is ready to be installed. Hopefully it will be metal, clay or ceramic. Estimated completion: early May 2016.
