Your Fire Department responded to 19 calls in March:

8 medical 2 elevator entrapments 3 vehicle accidents 2 public assists 3 false alarms 1 brush fire

Please be respectful of our rough seas and stay aware of rip current advisories. We have already had one drowning this year.

[The State will still post the large portable lighted sign on Fort Morgan Road just off Hwy. 59 when there is a weather advisory of long-running rip currents. Also, beginning this month, when they learn of such a threat, your volunteer fire department will advise the FMCA Webmaster Ernie Church and he will post the warning on the FMCA website: www.fortmorgancivic.org]

ADEM will be issuing a burn ban beginning on May 1st and ending on October 31st. This is an environmental burn ban to help improve air quality and has nothing to do with dryness due to lack of rain. Cooking fires will be allowed and all other fires will be illegal.

Our Board Meetings and Training Meetings are held at Fire Station No. 1 and both are open to the public. Board Meetings begin at 5:30 PM on the 2nd Tuesday of each month, and our Training Meetings begin at 6:30 PM on the 1st and 3rd Mondays each month.

We also discussed TA-17001, which will create a new zoning designation HDR, High Density Residential with an increased maximum density of 12 units per acre. Following our committee meeting on April 4 we had sent a letter to the Planning Commission requesting that District 25 be exempt from this HDR zoning because of the effects increased density would have on the health, safety and general welfare of our residents and guests. The county officials agreed that this was a reasonable request

Ernie Church has been appointed to the Board of Adjustment. He is also our webmaster and will post the request packages for rezoning, variances, and permits on our website. Our advisory committee meetings are open meetings held in the fellowship hall of Shell Bank Baptist Church

We also considered a permit application for the installation of a second monopole cell phone tower at the substation on Mobile Street and Highway 180. The new pole would be 140' high. The original pole is 104' and will be removed within two years. The only concern expressed was for the active Osprey nest on the existing tower, that there be no construction or removal activity while the nest is occupied. Fish and Wildlife Service has been contacted and asked to submit comment. The idea was that comment from the Service would carry more weight that one from our committee.

Our committee will meet at 9:00 am on Wednesday, May 3, to consider V-170019, a request from Asa and Mary Hollowell, 4428 Hwy 180, to be able to rebuild two residential dwellings on this one lot (50' X 900') where there were two which were grandfathered in when zoning was enacted. He has expressed concern for the possibility of hurricane destruction. Signs advertising this meeting have been posted on Fort Morgan Road near both Fire Stations.

The two recent requests for reduced set-backs to allow for construction of single family dwellings on small lots on Our Road and Cherokee Road were approved by the Board of Adjustment in its meeting on April 9.

The Fort Morgan Planning and Zoning Advisory Committee will post on our website [www.fortmorgancivic.org] re-zoning and variance request notices received from the county commission. Please refer other non-FMCA property owners who wish to stay up to date to our website. Notices of rezoning requests are posted on the property involved and mailed to adjacent landowners by the County.

FMCA also will send a special email to all members on our email list of the time and place of our Fort Morgan committee meeting and will post signs on Fort Morgan road near both fire stations. Our email notice to members is to let non-adjacent property owners who may be affected by the request express their concerns to our local committee before it submits a recommendation to the county. Any FMCA member who receives the Fort Morgan NEWS by U.S. Postal Service and wishes to receive these rezoning request notices will have to furnish us with an email address, to be sent to Chan West at: chan@goefish.com.

We encourage property owners with vested interests to bring their concerns and comments to these meetings. In most cases these notices are received about 10 days before the county Planning and Zoning Commission or Board of Adjustments meeting.

Fort Morgan Hurricane Re-Entry Pass Update



Baldwin County has elected not to mail Fort Morgan residents decals for the 2017-2018 season. As a courtesy, re-entry decals for Fort Morgan residents may be picked up in-person at Gulf Shores City Hall Revenue Division. Two decals per unit may be purchased at the cost of \$5 each, unless a hurricane or tropical storm watch has been issued for our area, in which case the fee doubles. Everyone who requests a decal will be required to show strict proof of residency in the form of a deed, lease or utility bill, bearing the address for which the decal is being obtained, along with proof of identity. No decals will be mailed. Decals are available now. The city will not issue a decal after a hurricane or tropical storm warning has been issued.


