Fort Morgan Volunteer Fire Department...... Chief Glenn Stevens

Your Fire Department responded to 20 runs in January:

- 9 medical
- 7 false alarms
- 3 elevator entrapments
- 1 vehicle accident

Every 3-5 years, the Insurance Services Organization (ISO) inspects fire departments for equipment, personnel, maintenance records, training records, incident records, and fire hydrants. This inspection grades fire departments with a score that is used to set the fire insurance premiums for the community. We are expecting a visit from ISO sometime during the first half of 2019. One component of the ISO inspection that Fort Morgan cannot provide is an on-site training facility. A qualified facility includes a drill tower and a burn room that is located on a 2-acre plot of land completely cleared of brush and trees. Our problem is locating a 2-acre tract of land that contains no protected wetlands and no beach mouse habitats. Any help from the public on this matter would be appreciated.

Don't forget that our meetings, located at Fire Station No. 1, are open to the public. Board meetings are held on the second Tuesday each month at 5:30 p.m., and our training meetings are held on the first and third Mondays each month at 6:30 p.m
