Request for contributions – please contact FMCA newsletter editor if you are interested in researching Fort Morgan history or providing personal memories to share of Fort Morgan

Bonnie Lowry recently wrote about the Gasque Post Office. I have personal memories of it from the late 1930 - 1940's. Mr. Will Galloway was the mail carrier. He would have to drive north from the Fort Morgan Road to the Intracoastal Waterway Canal, row a boat to Bon Secour to collect the Gasque mail. Return and deliver the mail to the Post Office and to permanent residents, who had mail boxes. We were summer residents and had to go to the Post Office to get our mail. This was before there were telephones down this way; however, there was overnight mail from Mobile.

Mrs. Violet Nelson was the postmistress. One of my brothers and I would be charged with walking to get the mail. The Post Office was an enclosed cubicle at one end of the front porch of her home. The door had been cut in half. When you knocked, she would open the top half. The mail was stored in a galvanized garbage pail – to protect it from the mice! MS Violet would open the pail, hold up to her eyes a pair of glasses with temples missing, which was tied to a string affixed to one of the pail handles, and find any mail for my family.
