April 11: FMCA welcomes <u>Ms. Debbie Harbin</u> from <u>Share the Beach</u> as our guest speaker! Debbie Harbin is the team leader for the Fort Morgan Share the Beach team. She has been a member of Share the Beach for 11 years and team leader for 7 years. Share the Beach is our local Sea Turtle Conservation program that helps protect visiting Endangered Sea Turtles and their hatchlings on the beaches of Fort Morgan. <u>Each year between May 1 - October 31</u>, our beaches become a nesting area for Endangered Sea Turtle. The hatchling sea turtles begin their lifelong journey right here on our beaches. When they become adults, the females return to the same location where they were born to nest and continue the circle of life for a new generation of sea turtles. Share the Beach volunteers work daily to help protect sea turtles and their nests. You can do you do your part by leaving only footprints on the beach at the end of each day so sea turtles have a safe place to nest (including filing in large holes that could trap & harm adult and hatchling sea turtles). You should also turn off all exterior lights facing the Gulf of Mexico or switch to the <u>Amber Light Bulbs</u> which are sea turtle friendly and approved by US Fish & Wildlife Agency. https://www.facebook.com/ShareTheBeachAlabamaSeaTurtles/

FMCA will be donating 50 amber light bulbs to residents and members who live along the beaches facing the Gulf (one per residence). Come and get your Sea Turtle Friendly Light bulbs at the meeting on April 11 and help to Protect Our Endangered Sea Turtles (*) ?!!

US Fish & Wildlife

The efforts continue to have Pine Beach Trail renamed in honor of Chan West. Jackie Sablan of Bon Secour Wildlife Refuge reports that things are still progressing. But to keep in mind that it is the federal government and that it will take time. The search continues for a replacement for the Director, Jeremy Phillips. We hope to see a replacement by Spring.

Alabama Legislature

Please continue to keep our state representative Steve McMillian and his wife Gayle in your prayers as they battle cancer. The ARPA expenditure was passed and there are items that may affect us. There was \$277 million allocated for Broadband Internet. \$225 million for Water/Sewer & Clean Water Infrastructure. \$10 million for Volunteer Fire Departments. More to follow on these.

ALDOT

Fort Morgan Road overlay project is nearly complete. Please let me know if you see any major issues. i.e.: pavement cracking, paint stripping issues, missing reflectors. Please note that the large painted abbreviations along the roadway are not related to the paving but are related to the proposed ADOC Bike Path.

Baldwin County

FMCA has been working with Baldwin County's Emergency Management Agency (EMA) to create signs that will be posted in Fort Morgan at beach access points and our local businesses related to Water Safety. An update will be forthcoming at the next meeting. When we get an update, we will share the details with the FMCA membership. We are also working with the county to try to procure (2) large mobile signs that would be kept here on the peninsula for use when hazardous or emergency situations occur.

The PRD application is extremely long and too big to put all the pdfs on the website; linking with the County is not allowed.

The Fort Morgan Planning & Zoning Advisory Board has an opening for a new appointment by FMCA to the committee. If you are interested, please email fortmorgancivic@gmail.com. We hope to make this appointment during our May 9th FMCA General Meeting. FMPZAC members must be a resident and registered voter in Fort Morgan District. Additional information about the FMPZAC is in the excerpt below from AL Code § 45-2-261.62 (2019).

<u>Section 45-2-261.62</u> Planning and zoning advisory committee established; composition; purpose and duties.

(a) There is established the Fort Morgan Planning and Zoning Advisory Committee, hereinafter referred to as the planning and zoning advisory committee, to be composed of the following members: Two members appointed by the Baldwin County Commission from a list of not less than four nominations by the Fort Morgan Civic Association, Inc.; and three members appointed by the Fort Morgan Civic Association, Inc. All members shall be residents and registered voters in the Fort Morgan District. All members shall serve a term of four years and may be reappointed to succeeding terms. Members shall serve until a replacement is appointed and qualified. Any vacancy on the committee shall be filled by the original appointing authority. Members shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for expenses in the performance of their duties by the county. A member may be removed for cause by his or her original appointing authority....

(b) The planning and zoning advisory committee shall adopt bylaws to administer this subpart. The planning and zoning advisory committee shall select a chair and may create other offices. The term of the chair shall be two years with eligibility for reelection. The planning and zoning advisory committee shall hold one regular meeting each six months or upon call of the chair and shall keep a record of its actions, all of which shall be a public record. The planning and zoning advisory committee shall be subject to the Alabama Open Meetings Act and other requirements of this subpart. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum.

(c) The purpose of the planning and zoning advisory committee shall be to make recommendation to the Baldwin County Planning and Zoning Commission concerning any proposed changes to zoning ordinances or regulations or the master plan, or variances thereto, related to the Fort Morgan Zoning District.

Fort Bowyer

Fort Bowyer was a small wooden fort built on the sands of Mobile Point peninsula to guard the entrance to Mobile Bay during the War of 1812. It was located near the site of where Fort Morgan is located today. Fort Bowyer was an important part of the of Mobile Bay during the War of 1812. The fort withstood one British assault in September 1814, altering British plans to take New Orleans, but succumbed to a second, much larger assault in February 1815 just before news arrived that a peace treaty had been signed. Two days after Fort Bowyer fell, the British commanders received news that the Treaty of Ghent, which ended the War of 1812 and all fighting in the region, already had been signed. The fort was returned to the United States. It was later abandoned and replaced by the

heavier fortifications of Fort Morgan. Fort Bowyer is widely considered to be the site of the last land battle between the United States and the British in the War of 1812.
